 reunited to my Soule and together with it receive and enjoy everlasting felicitie and happiness
 amongst the blessed Saints and Angels of God in Heaven in regard I doe assyuredly believe
 that he will through the Merits and onely Mediation of my Sorrowous Jesus Christ pardon and
 forgiue mee all my Sinned and forgiuing that temporall Estate wherof it hath pleased God
 to bless mee with & give devise and dispose therof as followeth viz: Imprimis & give and
 bequeath unto John Bradlye son of my brother John Bradlye deceased to my brother
 M William Bradlye and M Richard Bradlye Twenty shillings a piece to buy each of them

 my Soth Mabel Brown and to the two child her daughter the summe of fiftie shillings a
 piece Item & doe give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Daunc my sitt Sorone and
 her toale and my red Scarf & Hooke and my Blt greene Apron and my Scarff and my
 hoodes and my Two-laced Boniffe and Two paire of laced Guffe suitable to them Item & give
 and bequeath unto my Servant Elizabeth Steward the feather bed bolster and pillow whiche
 she lyd on and the two Blanckets and Lugg belonging to the same bedd and my Blak Clothe
 Brown and Bllyeate Item & give and bequeath unto Jane Smyth of Brampton
 aforesaid Widdow my George Sonne and Bllyeate Item & doe appoint only the summe of
 Twenty shillings to be laid out and disbursed by my Executor upon my funerall Item & give
 and bequeath unto the parke of the Warish whereof shall be buried Twenty shillings
 in bread to be given at the Church on the day of my funerall Item & doe hereby make
 ordene my loving Sonn Thomas Daunc my sitt and absolute Executor of this my last Will
 and Testament unto whom I give all the rest of my Estate real and personall debts
 money & place fitfull household stuff and things whatsover whiche I shall dye possesse
 of (my debts legaynes and funerall charged being first paid and deducted) Item &
 doe appoint M Heill Starward of Brampton aforesaid and me John M. Winterott
 ring to be overseers of my funerall Lastly & doe hereby revoke and annulle all former
 and other Wills or me made and doe publish and declare this to be my last Will and
 Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and seal the day and
